

5. For each recyclable material, can you indicate whether it was sent direct to a UK waste reprocessor, or passed on to a waste contractor?

<b>Council</b>	<b>Reply</b>
Barnsley	Commingled cans and glass sent to a local waste contractor for separation, then delivered on to reprocessors. Glass is further colour separated on site and delivered locally for reprocessing. Garden waste and cardboard are processed locally, producing compost soil conditioner for local farms.
Bassetlaw	Waste disposal is the responsibility of Nottinghamshire County Council.
Bolsover	All materials passed on to waste contractors
Boston	Kerbside (blue bin) material - sent to a Material Recovery Processor (MRF) in Peterborough who clean, separate and process the material. Bringsite (bottle banks etc) material - Paper and card is cleaned and processed by ourselves and sold, Glass is picked up and processed by a glass processing contractor. Cans are picked up and processed by a local company. Textiles are processed by Salvation Army, Oxfam and Merlin Products. Books are processed by the British Heart Foundation.
Bradford	Paper – UK waste reprocessor Glass and cans – UK waste reprocessor Garden Waste – UK waste processor Plastic bottles – waste contractor
Calderdale	Recycling is contracted to Focsa Services UK, as such it is their decision as to where the material is taken.
Chesterfield	Glass – Berrymans Aluminium – Bill Howarth Metals or Richard Fletcher Metals, then Alcan Steel, then Corus Paper – Abitibi Bowater Textiles – Kettering Textiles on behalf of Salvation Army Bring site plastics – to RECLAIM for sorting, then plastic is sold through RECOUP
Craven	Glass, tins/cans – Glass Recycling UK Ltd, Barnsley Paper – Abi-Con Recycling Ltd, Cheshire, Rishton Waste Paper Ltd, Rishton . Tins/Cans – Crossley Evans, Shipley, Textiles, Books – Salvation Army, Oxfam, Shoes – European Recycling, Plastics – Waste Management Group ( Valpak ) – Preston, Garden Waste – Yorwaste, Ripon & Growing with Grace, Clapham

Doncaster	All materials collected sent directly to licensed UK waste processors.
East Lindsey	All materials are taken to a Waste Transfer Station provided by Lincolnshire County Council. Lincolnshire County Council then arrange for these materials to be taken to a Materials Recycling Facility.
East Riding	<b>East Riding of Yorkshire Council has a purpose built MRF for the sorting and bulking of paper, cans and plastic bottles. All materials, except reusable TV's and a small amount of cardboard, were sent to a UK-based reprocessor.</b>
Hambleton	Large town sites: Glass – GRUK in Barnsley – UK reprocessor Paper – Cutts Brothers – Cheshire Recycling UK Textiles – Salvation Army and British Heart Foundation Cans – Todd Waste Management – waste contractor Plastic - Todd Waste Management – waste contractor Mini village sites: Glass, cans and paper - Todd Waste Management – waste contractor Kerbside Paper – Yorwaste – waste contractor Green Waste – Yorwaste – UK waste reprocessor.
Harrogate	Kerbside material (paper glass & cans) – split between waste contractor and waste reprocessor depending on which vehicle collects, vast majority goes to waste reprocessors. Garden waste – waste contractor Bring Sites: Glass, Newspaper and Cans go to waste reprocessor. Textiles, shoes and books to charities. Plastic bottles and cartons taken by a waste contractor.
Hull	All materials managed by our waste management contractor who then sends the materials to various UK outlets. All outlets are approved and audited by Hull City Council.
Kirklees	All kerbside collection taken to Sita Kirklees, except glass which goes direct to reprocessor.
Leeds	Kerbside collected by in-house collection service and delivered to two contracted MRF operators – HW Martin in Leeds, Sita Kirklees in Huddersfield.
Lincoln	To Sept 06 materials handled via Cory Environmental Municipal Services MRF at Lincoln and sold to paper mills or other established UK reprocessors. Post Sept 07 materials handled by Lincolnshire County Council Waste Disposal Authority.

Mansfield	Passed to Nottinghamshire County Council the Waste Disposal Authority or their delegated disposer.
Newark/Sherwood	Passed to Nottinghamshire County Council the Waste Disposal Authority or their delegated disposer.
NE Derbyshire	The recyclable materials are dealt with by a waste contractor.
NE Lincolnshire	Greenwaste and cardboard to local farm composters, Glass to UK Glass, Paper to Aylesford Newsprint and Stora Enso Belgium, Plastic bottles, sent to Baylis Recycling, Slough to be separated, then to UK/republic of Ireland reprocessors, Metal goes to CORUS.
North Kesteven	All material taken to a private MRF to be sorted. Once sorted, some materials are sent for reprocessing in UK, some sent overseas.
North Lincs	Kerbside Glass, Cans, Textiles, Paper and Plastics handled by waste contractor, with a separate contractor for supermarket and community recycling banks.
Richmondshire	All materials sent to waste contractor
Rotherham	Garden waste and cardboard - UK waste processor Paper - UK waste processor Blue box collection of Cans / Textiles / Bottles / aluminium foil handled by waste contractor.
Ryedale	All dry recyclable kerbside material delivered to a local contractor with waste transfer station. Garden waste to local farmers. Bring banks collected by private companies and sold to reprocessors.
Scarborough	All materials sold through Yorwaste. As far as they are aware, all materials sold on in UK.
Selby	Glass goes directly to Rockware Glass, Knottingley. Cans go to a local reprocessor in Sherburn in Elmet. Paper/card is stored and baled by a company based in Thirsk and then sold to UK paper mills. Green waste is taken to a number of local farms where it is composted on site and spread back onto their land.
Sheffield	Green waste – composted in S. Yorks Glass – Berrymans. West Yorks Paper/Card – taken to Severnside and Cutts Bros, for bailing at Ellesmere Port or Europe Cans etc – Aluminium to EMR, who in turn send to Novelis in Warrington, Steel to Corus UK Wood – Plevin in Newark to use in chipboard Oils – ECO-oil, Teesside Plastics – collected by Reclaim, sold onto RECOUP, who sell onto various reprocessors in UK, Holland and Hong Kong Electrical Equipment – various end destinations,

South Holland	Commingled materials taken to waste contractor.
South Kesteven	Commingled materials taken to waste contractor.
Wakefield	<p>Paper and card – sorted by contractor – Blackburn’s paper merchants at Dewsbury, then sent to Shotton Paper Mill in Ellesmere Port, Cheshire  Garden Waste – direct to compost pad at Welbeck, or on farm composting schemes in Yorkshire region  Cans – material from containers sorted by council/community organisation in Wakefield into steel and aluminium types. Sent to Waste Contractors – Morley Waste Traders. Materials from Kerbside Scheme sent to waste contractor for sorting, Glass Recycling UK in Barnsley.  Plastic Bottles – material from containers sorted by council/community organisation in Wakefield into different plastic types. Sent to Waste Processors – Linpac and Recoup. Materials from kerbside scheme sent to waste contractor for sorting.  Glass Bottles – sent to waste processor, either Glass Recycling UK in Barnsley or Berrymans in South Kirkby.  Textiles – materials collected and sorted by Waste Contractor – Wilcox Textiles</p>
West Lindsey	All recyclables collected were sent to a local waste contractor.
York	The provision and success of any recycling scheme is reliant on the ability to secure end markets for the materials collected. Securing these end markets is a specialist function and therefore this responsibility is placed with Yorwaste who are the council's main contractor for the provision of waste management services.
